



Alberto Pérez-Gómez, born in Mexico City, studied architecture there before earning an M.A. and a Ph.D. from the University of Essex, England. He has taught at London's Architectural Association, and universities across Mexico, the US, and Canada.

In 1983, he became Director of Carleton University's School of Architecture and in 1987, was appointed Bronfman Professor of Architectural History at McGill University in Montreal, where he founded the History and Theory Post-Professional Programs.

He became Emeritus Professor in January 2020. Pérez-Gómez's research interests include phenomenology, enactive cognitive science, and hermeneutics in architecture.
