Mark Alan Hewitt is an architect, historian, and preservationist based in New York. Educated at Yale and the University of Pennsylvania, Hewitt has taught at several prominent U.S. architecture schools and his practice specializes in architectural conservation, adaptive reuse, and traditional design. He advocates for sustainable design, historic preservation, and housing equity.

Hewitt has authored seven books and numerous articles, focusing on American architecture from the Progressive era and biographies of American architects. His latest work, "Draw In Order to See," examines architectural design through cognitive neuroscience and embodiment. A Fellow of the American Institute of Architects and recipient of the Arthur Ross Award, Hewitt continues to integrate sciences and humanities in his research.
